First Camp Opens For Unattached Indigent Women

Offering unattached women of the state the same opportunity as that extended unattached men at scores of government work camps, the first federal camp for women in California has been opened at Pacific Grove in Monterey County. It was announced today by H. A. B. Carleton, who heads the government relief service in the state for transients and unattached state homeless.

The new camp, one of the first of its kind in the United States, has started with an enrollment of 25 women, which quota is to be increased to a capacity of 125. The camp will be open to any indigent resident single women, upon application to any county, state, or federal welfare agency, Carleton declared.

Women camps will be under the supervision of Mrs. L. D. Ganyard, director of women's work for the State Emergency Relief Administration, according to the announcement.
