**Chinese Singer Will Be Heard At M. E. Church**

**Richard Low Will Fill Pulpit Morning and Evening Sunday**

Richard Low, radio's only Chinese baritone, will be heard in a concert of sacred music at the First M. E. church in Torrance next Sunday evening. Mr. Low has sung on a number of Chautauqua circuits, among them the famous Redpath Chautauqua. He has traveled in 42 states, singing, entertaining and lecturing. At the morning service next Sunday Mr. Low will speak on "China and Christianity" and will sing one number. In the evening at 7:30 o'clock he will present a program of vocal numbers and will speak on "China and Her Customs." He is filling the pulpit at this church in the absence of the pastor, Rev. Kemp J. Winkler.

The program for the evening service will be as follows: Prelude by the church pianist. Hymn by the congregation, "Open the Gates of the Temple," "Absent" and "The Holy City." Offertory and benediction, the "Prayer Perfect," sung by Mr. Low. Scripture lesson: "Lord, I Want to Be a Christian." "Were You There?" and "Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen," sung by Mr. Low.
