### Palos Verdes Estates

#### Reorganization Following Trustee's Sale Is Expected Shortly

The Palos Verdes Estates will be put up for sale shortly at a trustee's sale. It was disclosed this week coincident with action of Los Angeles county superior court in approving a petition for "revamping" of the valuable property, held by Frank A. Vanderlip and others.

Petition for confirmation of an agreement whereby the affairs of the Estates are to be reorganized was approved Monday by Superior Judge Emmet H. Wilson, in an action brought by Chris N. Test, person, against several trust companies.

The action was originally brought to restrain a sale of the property for non-payment of a trust deed. The compromise has been under consideration by representatives of the trust companies for approximately a year. The trust companies are the Union Bank and Trust Company of Los Angeles, The Commonwealth Trust Company, and the Bank of America National Trust and Savings Association.

The proposal as submitted to the court after having been approved by the various interested groups and by E. A. Lynch, as trustee in bankruptcy of the estate of E. G. Lewis, provides that the property shall be sold under the trust deed, and that a corporation to be hereafter organized will purchase the property at the trustee's sale. Preferred stock is to be issued to holders of first mortgage bonds, and their representatives will control the corporation until the preferred stock is retired at par plus interest at 7 percent per annum. Thereafter the corporation will pass into the control of the holders of the common stock.

Evidence at the hearing disclosed that non-convertible notes in the principal sum of \$1,300,000

were outstanding, of which 65 percent in number and amount, or \$841,750, were represented at the hearing. Bonds to the amount of \$812,000 principal sum also are outstanding, of which 97 percent had been deposited with the bondholders' committee. A \$20,000 water bill also is past due, and if it remains unpaid the water company will become insolvent, a representative of the trustee testified. Schools are badly crippled because of the non-payment of taxes in the district for the past three years. The operation of the schools at the present time was made possible by the fact that Frank A. Vanderlip had paid the taxes on his property in the school district, otherwise they would be compelled to close for lack of funds.
