Ford Exhibit Steel Rises At San Diego Exposition



With more than 40 per cent of the steel work already erected, contractors promise completion of the steel work for the Ford Motor Company's exhibit palace at the California Pacific International Exposition, San Diego, opening May 29, on or before April 15. Then the pouring of the reinforced concrete for the great circular exhibit building will get under way.

Out on the tip of a promontory skirted by three deep gulches, hundreds of workmen are engaged in welding four hundred and fifty tons of great steel trusses and girders for the framework of the Ford Motor Company's exhibit palace at the California Pacific International Exposition in San Diego, which opens May 29.

Present indications are that the framework will be in place before the scheduled date, April 15. When the thousands of yards of reinforced concrete have been poured, the great circular edifice will take form overlooking a series of terraces on which will be shown replicas of the famous roads of the Pacific. Already the terraces are formed and bits of these old trails are taking their position, including the planked roads which were part of the desert picture in Arizona and California.

The Company has let contracts in line with its established policy and that of the Exposition officials, California labor and California contractors having been given the benefit. Thus far, the Company has awarded contracts to the Daley Corporation, San Diego, for grading; B. O. Larsen, San Diego, for the foundation; and the Pacific Coast Steel Corporation and Consolidated Steel Corporation, Los Angeles, for bits of these old trails are taking
