

"FOREIGN TRADE FOR DOMESTIC AID"



Foreign Trade Week, started nine years ago by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce as a means of emphasizing the vital importance of overseas commerce to national prosperity, will be observed throughout the United States from May 19 to 25.

Sponsoring the event are the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, and the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce. More than 150 cities, including the nation's principal ports, will participate, with service clubs and other types of organizations staging special programs. National radio events are scheduled, among them addresses by Secretary of Commerce Roper and Secretary of State Hull.

Southern California's observance is under the direction of Dr. R. B. von KleinSmid, president of the University of Southern California and noted internationalist. A special feature is the colorful free exhibit of imports and export products throughout the week in the Bartlett Building, Seventh and Spring streets, Los Angeles. Saturday, May 25, has been set aside as Los Angeles Harbor Day when boat trips around the waterfront will be available to the public without charge.

Public Stadium For Football In Hawaiian Isles

Territorial Legislature Asked to Pass Bill for Construction

HONOLULU, T. H. (U.P.)—Football has become so popular in Hawaii that when owners of the stadium, where most of the games are played, declined to permit games to be broadcast the rabid fans took the matter up with the Territorial Legislature.

Several years ago all high school and university games were described play-by-play over the radio. The idea was immensely popular since thousands of fans living on the other islands could not always attend the games. Owners of the stadium have banned broadcasting during the past two seasons.

Seek Public Stadium

Grid fans wanted until the legislature convened recently and have obtained introduction of a bill asking for construction of a public stadium at the University of Hawaii and specifying that all football games played there be broadcast to the other islands.

The bill provides that all games be broadcast "in order that taxpayers who may not be able to attend the games may be privileged at least to enjoy listening to them by radio."

Play Mainland Teams

Part of the heightened interest in football has resulted from the scheduling of games by the University of Hawaii team with prominent mainland universities. Last year, the university team played and defeated Denver University; University of California and a team of Pacific coast college stars.

This fall the university has games scheduled with University of Southern California; Denver University and University of California at Los Angeles.


