New Allowance Of Water For Welfare Clients

County Charities Sets Up Minimum Scale for Payment

Beginning July 1, a new schedule of water allowance for clients of the county charities department in the Torrance welfare district will be placed in effect, it was announced today by Superintendent Rex Thomson. The present flat rate of \$1 allowed for those who live in their own homes will be cancelled, the announcement stated.

Wide variation in water rates throughout the county has been disclosed by the department's survey. Schedules vary from 35 cents a month for families of eight or less, in county water districts Nos. 1, 10 and 12, to \$4.16 a month for families of nine or more in the Palms Verdes area.

In the Whittier welfare district, which serves a large section of the southeast corner of the county, there are 62 separate companies now operating with varied schedules of rates. There are 142 water companies operating in the county, it was disclosed by a comprehensive survey just completed.

The survey, Thomson said, was made to determine a schedule of water rates that would be equitable for all clients within the county and to economize on time of the department's employees who have had to set up special excess budgets to equalize the different rates charged by the 142 companies.

Following is the minimum rate of various companies operating in this vicinity, showing how they vary, and the number of persons that the minimum rate will provide for, as computed by the department:
