

Chevrolet Averages 21.75 Miles Per Gallon in 3000 Mile Run



Twenty-one and seventy-five one-hundredths miles to a gallon of gasoline. Only three and three-quarter quarts of motor oil and one quart of water in 3,000 miles! Those outstanding results were registered by a stock Chevrolet Master DeLuxe sedan recently at the conclusion of a certified 3,000-mile non-stop economy run staged by Ted Eades Chevrolet Company of Inglewood, California, with Ted Ellis at the wheel.
 The Chevrolet merchant inaugurated the run to learn the actual economy performance of the motor car under routine driving conditions such as encountered by the average vacationing Californian.
 The car was sealed by the Los Angeles deputy state sealers, Messrs. Charles M. Fuller and Frank J. Berka. This sealing operation included the crankcase and the ignition, thus rendering it impossible to stop the car except at the finish of the 3,000-mile journey.
 The route taken by Ted Ellis in putting the mileage on the car included a jaunt into Sequoia National Park, elevation 8,000 feet, where the mercury dropped to 33 degrees. At the opposite temperature extreme was Death Valley, where the car passed through heat of 110 degrees. Having in mind the fact that no fair test of a car's routine economy could be achieved without speed runs, Ted Ellis cruised the floor of famous Muroc Dry Lake at a pace ranging around 32 miles an hour.
 The stock Chevrolet Master DeLuxe sedan came through the hard test with no mechanical difficulties whatsoever, registering an average economy performance of 21.75 miles to the gallon of gasoline. When the crankcase seal was officially broken, only three and three-quarters quarts of motor oil had to be added to bring the indicator to "full" position. Only one quart of water was required to bring the water level to the top.
 After tabulating the results, Ted Eades expressed himself as more than satisfied with the workman-like manner in which the Chevrolet had again proved its right to the familiar slogan "Chevrolet for economical transportation."
