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

Chevrolet Has
Biggest Month
On West Coast
New Car and Truck Sales
During June Reach High
Mark of 9,237

Nine thousand two hundred and
thirty-seven Chevrolet cars and
trucks delivered at retail!
"The greatest single month of
sales in the history of Chevrolet
during June on the Pacific Coast."

That stirring news of record-
breaking achievement flashed over
the wires today, as auditors at the
big Oakland plant of the Chevrolet
Motor Company tallied the final
figure in recapitulation of new car
and truck retail sales for the
month of June. All previous sales
records for any one month, even
including those bonanza months
registered in the boom year of
1929, went by the boards when the
June sales results were tabulated
for the states of California, Oregon,
Washington, Idaho, Utah, Arizona
and the portions of Montana and
Wyoming served by the western
organization of Chevrolet.

than Los Angeles are Long Beach
second with \$122,920,400; Pasadena
\$78,099,925; Glendale \$50,751,015;
Beverly Hills, \$49,479,655; Santa
Monica \$39,239,110; Vernon \$31-
792,745; Alhambra \$20,018,470;
Burbank \$17,601,990, Culver City
\$10,405,110; El Segundo \$10,501,305;
Huntington Park \$14,760,210; In-
glewood \$11,289,305; Pomona \$11-
266,310; San Marino \$18,457,055;
Signal Hill \$27,237,510; and South
Gate \$10,779,490.

According to these figures Tor-
rance ranks eleventh among the
44 municipalities of the county,
exceeded among the smaller com-
munities only by Signal Hill with
its wealth of oil properties, Al-
hambra and Burbank.

Los Angeles county will have
approximately \$230,000,000 of addi-
tional taxable property upon which
to levy this year, it was revealed
this week with the report of
County Assessor Ed Hopkins to
the board of supervisors. Of this
sum, \$200,000,000 is the assessor's
estimate of the value of public
utilities, which are to be included
in the county's tax roll this year
for the first time since 1910.

Real estate values showed a de-
crease of more than \$1,000,000
while improvements showed a gain
of \$21,142,700 for the county as a
whole. Personal property also
showed a gain of \$8,486,500.

Two offers of property on
Crawens avenue in the vicinity of
the city hall, for building purposes
if and when the city constructs
the proposed new library, city hall
and auditorium, were ordered filed.
Prices named in the offers were
considered excessive.

A contract with the General
Petroleum Corporation for furnish-
ing gasoline to the city for the
next fiscal year was ordered drawn
up and executed. The corporation's
offer of 11 cents per gallon ex-
clusive of federal tax was consid-
ered the most acceptable bid.
Several other companies submitted
offers.

At the request of Police Com-
missioner W. H. Stanger, the sum
of \$105 was appropriated to cover
the cost of painting the cells and
office rooms in the city jail.

An appropriation of \$90 to pur-
chase two pianos for use at the
band stand and the WALTERIA
recreation department was ap-
proved. At present the piano in
the recreation department at 1335
Post avenue has to be moved
wherever required to the detriment
of the instrument and at a cost
of time and money for handling.

The sprinkler system at the city
park has now been completed and
is in operation.

St. Louis Losing Landmarks

Place has given up two—one con-
structed by the late John D. Perry,
