Norman Bright, Olympic Club of San Francisco athlete, and the only man to beat Louis Zamperini, is about 27 years old, and is a teacher. Bright should be on the team that goes to Germany next year, running the 5000 meter run. One thing certain about Norman Bright, he will never beat Louis Zamperini again. The local boy has his number now. Jesse Owens proved to the world that he is human, by letting Mistuh Peacock, another colored athlete, beat him two times in the 100-meter dash and also in the broad jump. Although Owens jumped 26 feet 2 1/2 inches, this was not far enough to win, the great strutting Peacock leaped to a new world's record (if accepted) of 28 feet 3 inches. If you don't believe 28 feet is very far, sometime when you have a few moments to spare measure this distance 'off. You will be surprised! The first three days of the trip Louis Zamperini lost SEVEN pounds, and Pete lost ELEVEN pounds. The mid-west heat was too much for the boys. Several sport writers are figuring Louis Zamperini to beat Gene Venzke in the Olympic tryouts next year and represent the United States, along with Bon-athon and Cunningham in the 1500-meter run next year in Germany. Cornelius Johnson, Compton Junior College high jumper, who won the N. A. A. U. title for the fourth consecutive year last week with a jump of six feet seven inches, is in the greatest consistent high jumper in the world. I have seen Johnson jump seven feet to clear six feet seven inches and some day he will clear this great height. His best jump is a fraction over six feet eight inches. If the jumping pit officials would put the bar at seven feet and half Johnson that it was six feet eight inches he would set an unbroken world record mark. Johnson gets excited when he tries for a record and sometimes his step. Some day this great negro jumper will astound the world with a seven-foot leap. He has three years of college competition left.

They will take a summer's rest, Pete in preparation for his work at U. S. C. and the spring training season, and Louis for the work that is ahead of him as a candidate for the 1936 Olympic team.

## World's Champion Is Now Rated Possible Third Man On Olympic Team

In view of his excellent showing at Lincoln, Louis is now rated a possible third man for the Olympic berth in the 1500 meters, with only Gene Cunningham and Venzke ahead of him in the running.

The trip east was worth a great deal to both boys for the experience they gained in meeting unknowns. Louis was defeated by Norman Bright in the 1500-meter run by a scant two yards. The Torrance miler says his defeat to inexperience, and is sure that on their next meeting he will be able to show his heels to Bright, who is a typical sprinter. Louis made the mistake of letting Bright lead all the way and was taken by surprise when the Olympic man came home with his sprint. Louis sprouted to catch him, but Bright had gained about three yards on him by his unexpected move, a head that Louis was not able to cut down more than a yard in the short distance remaining before they hit the tape. The two were practically alone at the finish, the third and fourth place men trailing 50 yards behind.

The fact that a high school boy, nine years younger than himself, was able to stay with him for the distance and come within striking distance of beating him on their first encounter, was a disagreeable surprise to Bright.

Pete, who entered in the 800-meter run, also attributes his defeat to inexperience, and feels that he made a mistake in not entering the 500-meter run, as he is an endurance runner and would have had an excellent chance to place among the first three. He was greatly handicapped by an aching wisdom tooth which suddenly came to life during the train trip and gave him much trouble in pain and loss of sleep. As it was he placed eighth in the 800 meters, and under the circumstances did well to finish. He plans to compete in the longer run next year and will campaign for a berth on the Olympic team in this event.
