



The Waleria playground committee, Jean Andrews, chairman, invited the city council to attend the Christmas tree and program at Waleria on Monday evening, December 23, at 7:30 o'clock.

A resolution was adopted authorizing the payment to Roscoe Moss Company of the sum of \$3,669.30 as part of the contract price for the second well being drilled on city property. A balance of \$1,730.70 remains to be paid.

Palos Verdes Estates invited the mayor and city council to attend a good will drive to be held at the clubhouse in that community next Saturday.

A letter from the Chamber of Commerce was read asking the council to refer the matter of removing trees and replanting others in the residential district to a committee for recommendations. The chamber also expressed the opinion that no action should be taken except on the advice of a competent planning commission or a nurseryman. The letter was placed on file.

In connection with this letter, City Clerk Bartlett stated that a letter had been received signed by 16 property owners residing on El Prado asking the council to meet with them at 8 o'clock Wednesday evening to consider the tree planting situation.

surgeon, stated. Smith took the stand and claimed he only had shoved Sewell after Sewell had threatened him. Sewell became abusive, he said, and he could not tolerate him in his place of business.

A relative of the deceased, Bernhard Wendt, of 2289 243d street, Lomita, stated that Sewell had been drinking considerably on the day of the trouble. The inquest was conducted by Deputy Coroner Frank R. Monfort.

Sewell was taken to the hospital Friday evening about 7:30 o'clock after an alleged altercation at Smith's Cafe, corner of Narbonne avenue and Lomita boulevard, where it is said he had created a disturbance. According to the report of the affair on file at the sheriff's sub-station No. 3, Sewell had been drinking and had behaved in a "boisterous and abusive" manner in the cafe.

The proprietor, Charles Martin Smith, asked Sewell to leave and a struggle ensued in which the men finally emerged into the street where according to the report Sewell fell down. Officers Eisenberg and Deal, of the radio patrol, were summoned, and Sewell was taken to the hospital where he was examined by a local physician.

He appeared to be suffering from shock, as well as from his injuries which on first examination appeared to be no more serious than a gash in his scalp which was sutured and a laceration inside his lower lip.

Sewell's condition remained unchanged until 4:10 a. m. Saturday when he died.

Sewell, who is said to have been an oil man who has been employed in fields all over the world, has been living with his sister-in-law and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. Bernard C. Wendt, at the Lomita address. From them officers learned that Sewell leaves a wife, Mrs. Marie Sewell, 1519 Aster street, Chicago, Illinois, and a son in England.
