**Summer Classes
In Piano Open
Next Tuesday**

Kathryne Buffington Offers
Group Instruction to
Beginners

Kathryne Buffington, pianist-teacher, will conduct classes in piano for beginners at her studio-home, 1548 Post avenue, starting July 14. This is the fifth summer Mrs. Buffington has held these classes and the increased enrollment each year indicates the favor with which the work is held.

The advantages of class piano, which makes possible the study of music under an experienced teacher at a modest cost is recognized and endorsed by many eminent authorities. Mrs. Buffington has studied extensively under leading normal training teachers, is a graduate in music of Washington State College, and for the past four years has been a pupil of Richard Buhlig, distinguished pianist and teacher of Los Angeles and Berlin.

In the past few years there has been a tremendous growth and development in the teaching of pre-school children, proving that under proper instruction and materials the child of 4, 4½ and 5 can be very successful in the study of music. Never is it so necessary to have superior training as in the early stages of study, and class lessons permit children to have a competent teacher when it is most necessary and at a reasonable fee.

Modern equipment, such as the magic board, the rhythm orchestra and flash card drills do away with much of the old-time drudgery generally associated with the study of music, and interesting ways of presenting materials cause the student to become interested in music and wish to continue that study. Class work combines the playing at the piano, rhythmic training, harmony, ear training, sight reading and transposition into a course presenting the fundamentals of music, which leads to a recital at the end of the four weeks, at which time parents and interested friends can see what has been accomplished by the students. Parents interested in the class work are requested to make arrangements before the opening date, July 14.

In addition to the class work Mrs. Buffington is also teaching privately, beginners and advanced students, and is also conducting classes in harmony, rhythm and sight reading for students of other instruments who need to know the piano keyboard. There will also be classes in two-piano playing.

**Aged Man Dies
From Injuries
In Truck Crash**

Andrew Brumbelow Thrown
to Pavement As Autos
Collide

Andrew W. Brumbelow, 82, residing at 25914 Pennsylvania avenue, Lomita, died at the Georgia Street receiving hospital, Los Angeles, July 2, from injuries sustained in a fall from a truck. The accident occurred within a block of the home of his daughter, Mrs. Clorah Palmer, 338 W. 111th street, Los Angeles, when the truck, driven by George Dugan, was struck by another machine as it was making a turn off Broadway into 111th street.

Mrs. Palmer is building an apartment house in the city and employed Dugan to haul sand from pits in Lomita. Mr. Brumbelow had ridden into the city with Dugan on one of his trips. When the collision occurred the aged man was thrown to the street and was crushed about the chest. He lived only a short time after reaching the hospital.

Brumbelow had resided in Lomita for 17 years, coming to California from Oklahoma where he had been engaged in farming. He leaves his widow, Mrs. Alloe Brumbelow; two daughters, Mrs. Palmer, of Los Angeles; Mrs. Annie Willett, of Acton, and three sons, Clarence, Cleveland, both of Lomita, and Welcome Brumbelow, of Venice.

Funeral services were held at Stone & Myers chapel, in this city, yesterday, at 1:30 o'clock p. m. Interment was made at Inglewood Park cemetery.

Our Feet On the Ground

Three years ago, when times began to get better, the "viewers with alarm" and the "prophets of despair" told us it wouldn't last. Since that time the per capita income in America has risen some \$100 annually, and industrial production is back to the level of 1927.

One would get the idea from this that the upswing is no mere temporary bulge, but is actually sound at the core. And the other day a report came out that pretty well clinches the argument.

Real estate values are going up.

Now these seldom move during short-term flurries in the level of economic activity. Yet today in California land values are figured at around six percent better than at the first of the year, and thirty percent higher than depression lows.

Moreover, the national survey remarks, "given an increase of ten percent in general business activity, the continuance of easy money and no material change in real estate taxes, it is reasonable to expect further improvement in real estate values."

Of course, the adoption of any such tax change as the Single Tax to put the entire State tax load on land would completely nullify that promising prediction. But with half a chance, land values will come back to something like normal level.

And the best part of it is that this means we're advancing soundly all along the line.

To bring the matter closer to home, it means that with increasing real estate values, there will be more home building to relieve the serious housing shortage in Torrance and elsewhere throughout Southern California.

Let's keep our feet on the ground, and continue to go forward along sound lines.
