WAGES IN U. S. HARDER HIT THAN IN EUROPE UP TO '35

GENEVA, Dec. 2, (U.P.)—Total wages and salaries of workers in the United States were harder hit by the crisis than in most other important industrial countries, according to the findings of the international labor office.

Statistics which the office has compiled for 20 countries, including Great Britain, France and Germany, show that with possible exception of Austria and Poland, earnings in the United States have maintained a relatively low level since 1929.

The I. L. O.'s figures show that the nominal value of wages and salaries in the United States fell by 40 percent in 1932 compared with the 1929 level and by 43 percent in 1935. In 1934 it was only 35 percent below 1929, but it was still lower than any other country except Austria.

Comesback Staged in 1935 While in 1935 it fell short of the pre-crisis level by only 50 percent, it was still below that of France, Germany and Australia—countries for which figures are available. Taking 100 as the basis for 1929, the index for France in 1935 was 76, for Germany 74 and for Australia 80.

A comparison of the I. L. O.'s statistics for the real value of purchasing power of salaries and wages in various countries shows that the index in the United States fell from 100 in 1929 to 76 in 1932 and 75 in 1933. By 1934 it was up to 82, but this was still lower than in any other country except Austria; and while in 1935 it rose to 86, it was still below that of other countries for which figures are available. The index for France in that year was 91; for Germany 83, and for Australia 99.

COUNTY GETS TEMPORARY PAY LOAN

A temporary "loan" of \$5,000,000 was credited to the general fund and to the salary fund of Los Angeles county last week, to enable the county to meet cash requirements during the month and for the December payroll.

In making this loan the board of supervisors has done something that has never been done before, it was explained. The loan of funds is from the "surplus" of funds which the county treasurer has on hand at all times, running between \$50,000,000 and \$40,000,000. This money belongs to the various special districts as well as special divisions of the county government, and includes fire protection districts, water districts and so forth.

Upon previous occasions, the county auditor has "borrowed," with approval of the supervisors and the county counsel, funds from the capital account of flood control district. These funds, the remainder of the \$36,300,000 San Gabriel bond issue of 1924, are rapidly being depleted, however, as dam No. 1 is nearing completion. The last \$5,000,000 was sold several weeks ago, and the proceeds were borrowed almost immediately for the general fund in order to meet the Nov. 1 payroll, and cash requirements during the month of October.

Double Hanging Scheduled Dec. 4

Unless Gov. Frank F. Merriam intervenes, there will be a double execution at San Quentin prison Friday, Dec. 4. Warden Court Smith advised the governor's office that on that day Albert Walter, Jr., of San Francisco, and William Zirbes, of Sacramento, were scheduled to be hanged. San Quentin prison has a double gallows and it is possible to hang two men simultaneously. At Folsom there is a single gallows and in the case of double executions one victim must be removed before the next is hanged.

Would Localize Election Data

Supervisors Act to Have Information Broadened

Amendments to the state political code to provide for local publication of polling places and election board officials are being prepared by County Counsel Everett W. Mattoon upon instructions from the board of supervisors.

The board adopted a resolution drafted by the metropolitan unit of the publishers' association, introduced by Supervisor Gordon L. McDonough, on motion of Supervisor Leland M. Ford.

The resolution pointed out that these election boards were now published in a small legal newspaper of "insignificant circulation." The better local newspapers, however, pick up the list after the county pays to have it published in the small legal newspaper that circulates only in downtown Los Angeles and only because of this do local residents know who is serving on their local election boards.

The proposed amendment to the state political code is to be introduced at the 1937 session of the state legislature and support is anticipated from newspapers all over the state. Many members of the state legislature already have pledged their support to it.
