

Anthony Adverse Loved Her



Beautiful Olivia de Havilland portrays the drama-packed role of Angola, humble daughter of an Italian conierge who became the favorite of Napoleon Bonaparte, in Warner Bros. production of "Anthony Adverse." The film which opens at the Torrance theatre Sunday, has the largest cast on record. Fredric March has the title role.

For 30 years, Chief Cinematographer Tony Gaudio of Warner Bros. had looked thru the camera at motion picture scenes. But not until he photographed "Anthony Adverse," which starts a three-day run at the Torrance theatre Sunday, did he see a "slate" with the number 1,000 on it.
