PARIS. (U.P.)—Creed, the English tailor on the Rue Royale, shows a high, fitted waistline for formal town wear, but makes a low, loose waistline for sports and country wear. Two and even three different colors or tones of the same shade are used for these costumes. Many are three-piece ensembles with the skirt, jacket and top coat or cape of different shades.

The tailored vest is one of the new features in Creed's collection. Worn for sports, the vests have woolen fronts that button from the high neck to the waist, while the backs of the vests are of hand-knit wool. These checked or plain vests are patterned directly after a man's waistcoat, but are sometimes made with sleeves of lining-silk.

Creed shows a few knicker suits for country wear, but most of the skirts are not divided. A majority are wrap-around that button down the front from the waist to the hem and can be worn with the hem part way open to facilitate movement. As the skirt swings back, there is a glimpse of knee-length, fitted bloomers that are worn underneath. The bloomers are usually of a silk and wool mixture in a dark shade and match the lining of the top coat and the blouse of the country suit.

The tailored blouses are gay in pattern and color in light-weight woollens, printed silks, striped satins and taffetas. They are made high at the neck with long, fitted sleeves. The majority are tucked inside the skirt, altho a few overblouses also are shown.

The Corps de Ballet, under the direction of Serge Oukrainsky, started rehearsals this week for the Hollywood Opera Company's production of the grand opera "Carmen" at the Shrine auditorium, Friday night, Jan. 29.

Oukrainsky, who was brought to this country from Russia, by Mme. Pavlova, internationally famous dancer, declares his two ballerinas and the 40 members of the ballet will be trained to the minute, and that their performance will far outdo the ballet work of any performance of "Carmen" ever seen in Los Angeles. Paula de Cardo, who will be remembered for her sensational "Dance of Gold" in "Aida" will again be the premiere danseuse.

Rehearsals of the principals have also started under the direction of Aldo Franchetti who will act as musical director of this production. Franchetti is perhaps one of the best known conductors in the United States, having conducted symphonic and operatic orchestras in practically every large city in both this country and Europe.

The cast is headed by Julian Mario, famous Spanish tenor, who is making his operatic debut in California. It includes Marguerite Namara, who has sung the role many times in various cities in this country and abroad; Rodolfo Hoyos, extremely popular Mexican baritone, and Alphonso Pedroza, Mexican basso who was a sensation in "Aida" at the Shrine Thanksgiving night, complete the principals in the cast.

Library Showing Its Fine Books Until Saturday

Unusual interest in the Huntington library exhibition, "Fine Books," is being shown by visitors because of the observance of national printing education week, Jan. 15-22. This is a rare opportunity to see some of the greatest masterpieces of printing since Gutenberg first put printing on a practical basis nearly 500 years ago.

Most highly prized of the exhibits is one of the 12 remaining examples of vellum of the Gutenberg Bible. In the Huntington copy, the stately beauty of the printing is enhanced by rich illuminations in gold and colors by 15th century artists. No other book in the Huntington library exhibitions attracts so many visitors as does the Gutenberg Bible.

Other monuments of the printing craft include the books of the first printers of Italy and of early French book designers. Modern fine presses in England and the United States are also represented. Each book is considered a work of art. Altho the exhibition is intended primarily to give pleas-
