Lawsmiths Offer Some Peculiar Bills

California legislators, preoccupied with such minor problems as increased payments for old age security, state-operated oil drilling, and more rigid control of horse racing and liquor, nevertheless found time during the first half of the bifurcated session to take care of some of the more profound questions that beset the taxpayers.

The lawsmiths, laboring under the handicap which requires most of the bills to be submitted before the recess, put on a mighty sprint to get under the wire and before they went home such earth-shaking suggestions as providing money for a national egg-laying contest and establishing a "better race relations day" were before the two houses for future consideration.

Patriotic School Buses

Other proposals looking toward making California a better place in which to live included the following:

Amend the political code to eliminate the section which requires copies of the bills to be printed in English—future language not specified.

Require all school buses to be painted red, white and blue on the assumption the children riding in them will be inspired to greater heights of patriotic fervor.

Perforated, illuminated license plates for state-owned, tax exempt cars, so if used after regular daytime business hours and culprits might readily be spotted by tax-paying motorists.

Ban Animal Tenants

Provide special license plates bearing skull and crossbones with the legend: "habitual offender" written across the tags, such public brands to be meted out to drivers who constitute a menace to safety.

Allow Indians to buy liquor—this measure replacing suggestions made in other years to give the state back to them.

Strengthen provisions of an act relating to "keeping animals or poultry in apartment hotels or dwelling houses."

Bills also were presented outlawing "bank nights" at theatres and declaring invalid all breach of promise suits if "intention" is not stated in writing.

There can be no question about the musicianship of the orchestra or the capabilities of Conductor Mershon. What it lacks in brasses, the orchestra's strings make up in modulated tonal qualities. Mershon's conception of the Beethoven First was a lyrical rather than spirited performance. The Gorman suite was perhaps the least polished of the numbers but its appeal was evident.

In the Atlantis movements, especially the opening Nocturne, the orchestra's talents were shown to be splendidly arrayed. The comedy skit, with Conductor Mershon clowning through an "Arkansas Musicale" was an exuberant effort which the audience, adult and juvenile, thoroughly enjoyed. And the rendition of the national anthem with the audience joining the orchestra, was genuine inspirational.

More Concerts Desired

The presentation of Tschalkowsky's Andante Cantabile, Concerto by the string ensemble of three violins and cello, in memory of the late Mrs. Clara French Mowry was a reverent gesture and a melodious tribute to the beloved patroness of the Opera and Symphony association. Torrance C. Welch capably served as master of ceremonies and Rev. Homer Kellem's laudatory remarks were brief.

It is to be hoped that the Symphony association will generously take steps to give this city more concerts—free if they need be and if admission is charged, a small sum so that even larger crowds may enjoy the aggregation of musical talent trained by Conductor Mershon. The city council indicated several weeks ago when Scott R. Ludlow, former mayor and present city treasurer, made the request for financial aid to the free concert that it would support the orchestra if the people showed a responding interest.

Friday night's audience was a worthy response. The Symphony should go on.

Conductor Mershon's directorial gestures are sweeping, conclusive and powerful . . . but, unlike most orchestra leaders of little fame, he does not intrude his baton-weaving to annoyance of his audience. Considering his limited funds for music, musicians and all that makes a symphony, Mershon deserves much credit for the organization he has developed here.

"The Singing Cop's" appreciation of his two numbers: "I hope if any of you happen to meet trouble with any Long Beach authorities that I'll be the cop you deal with" could be taken in several different ways. We hope he means he'd overlook a traffic violation out of gratitude for the reception he received here.

Torrance C. Welch made an excellent "emcee." His remarks were brief and must have led Evangelist Kellem to keep his address short and to the point. After all, they both knew that the large audience was there to hear music, not speeches.

The orchestra made an impressive picture on the stage. The youngest member, Miss Billy May Weaver in a pink dress, bowed her violin with the same close attention to score as the oldest musician. Solo parts were confined to two—one in the Beethoven Symphony for the first violinist, Albert Green of Long Beach and the other in the I-Love Thee movement of Atlantis by Ed Brady whose horn performance was not quite up to par.

"Let's have more concerts!" was the general response to those fortunate enough to be present Friday night. Guess the city will have to dig down in its coffers for additional appropriations from now on . . . But it will be appreciated and it will give Torrance excellent publicity.

(Continued from Page 1-B) only to that particular neighborhood, and would feel it his duty to spend all of his energies in attempting to please the individuals of his district while the interests of the city as a whole would suffer. The ultimate result would be "political trading, logrolling, and back-patting."

"On the other hand, a councilman elected at large realizes that he is answerable to all of the people, and he knows that he will not be criticized by a majority of the electors if he refuses to favor a project in a particular neighborhood, when such a project would prove detrimental to the city as a whole.

Manager Plan Doubtful

"The city manager plan is one that deserves serious consideration. It has its merits as well as its short-comings. The Board of Freeholders, however, are of the opinion that the value of the city manager lies in his ability to save money by prudent purchasing.

"In a city where thousands are spent in the purchase of machinery, and where a great deal of street paving is done, it is possible to save tremendous sums. However, such expenditures in Torrance are negligible, and it is doubtful in my opinion whether or not a City Manager could actually save his own salary."

"It must be remembered, however, that these matters may be taken care of from time to time when the need arises by charter amendment or by legislative ordinances," Judge Lessing concludes.
