YOUR INCOME TAX

Collecting two billions of dollars is a big job, even for Uncle Sam. That is the estimated revenue to be received from the tax on incomes earned during the taxable year 1936. A direct levy on income as a taxing device was made possible only through amendment to our Federal Constitution—passed after 30 years of bitter controversy between Congress and the Supreme Court over constitutionality of such legislation. Presented herein are a few salient aspects of the Income Tax Law, as modified by our California community property situation.

Who Must File a Return: Every person living in the United States whose gross income for the taxable year amounted to \$5000 or every person whose NET income was

- (a) \$1000 if single, or if married but living apart;
- (b) \$2500 if married, and living together.

Also, certain informational returns must be filed by all persons making payment of tax on rent, etc., of \$1000 to single persons, or of \$2500 to married persons. Every partnership must file such a return showing partnership income, names of partners, and their respective interests in the income.

What Is Income:

If an employee, your income includes all wages, etc., received, minus any expense incurred in actually earning that income. Traveling expenses are thus deductible, but the cost of merely getting to and from work is not.

If you own a business, or engage in a profession, your income will be the receipts less all expenses properly chargeable to the business enterprise. Personal, living, or family expenses, improvements or assets may not be deducted from the taxable figure.

Deductions:

Certain personal expenses are deductible; these include interest and taxes paid; contributions up to 15 percent of the income made to religious and charitable funds. Gambling losses may be deducted only to the amount of gains from the same source. Alimony payments made, such as not deductible, nor may it be returned as income by its recipient.

Exempt From Tax:

Benefits from life insurance policy; workmen's compensation; amounts for gifts, bequests, damages for personal injuries; and salaries paid by the state or its subdivisions for governmental functions are not subject to the Federal Income tax.

Computation of Tax:

A normal tax of 4 percent is taken on the net income, after certain exemptions are taken. These exemptions include: \$1000 if single, or if not living with spouse; \$2500 if married and living together; an added \$400 for each person under 18, or who is incapable of self-support to whom you contribute 51 percent of such support. These exemptions are prorated to reflect changes in status during the year.


An earned income credit of 10 percent of all income received for personal services is also deductible.

A surtax of varying percent is charged on all income in excess of \$4000.

California Law:

Under our community property law, the earnings of the husband and/or wife are deemed community, in which the wife's interest is present, existing and co-equal with the husband's. This rule obtains despite the granting of an interlocutory decree. Thus, separate returns may be filed for husband and wife, so dividing the income and the exemptions between them that substantial savings in tax are effected. Such division may be prorated up until the entering of the final decree. But income from property ac-

Solving a Problem



Miss Doris Schuler is shown demonstrating what ship line officials decided to do on a larger scale when it was found the clearance of the Empire of Britain was a scant eight feet under the 225-foot Golden Gate Bridge. New Technique In Design Has Won Favor

The question of ceiling heights is one that has been discussed and disputed for years, and had not the necessity of economy weighed heavily on the side of low ceilings—the debate would doubtless still be raging.

The urge to cut down in every possible way on the unnecessary in planning has won many converts to the side of the low-ceiling advocates, and only the few who can afford it still remain in the ranks of those who prefer high ceilings.

It is probably just as well, for high ceilings do not go with small rooms, and the present-day tendency toward compactness which design and planning have shown, not only to hold down construction costs but operating costs as well, has called for rooms that are only large enough to perform their functions comfortably but without waste.

Not In Keeping

This new technique in house design has made the home a more efficient place to run, and one of the main items considered is heating cost and efficiency. High ceilings, of course, increase this cost, as there must be more heat to take care of the increased space such ceilings provide.

The old concept that low ceilings made for a warm house in summer, while true if compared to a house with high ceilings and high windows, is not true if the windows are low. But such windows go only with a large house and would be quite out of keeping with the typical home of today. If the heads of the windows are above the human head line, so that the hot layer of air that gathers at the ceiling may be drained off, a low-ceilinged room may be quite comfortable.

Insulation has also helped to protect the house from summer heat and is another factor in making low ceilings possible.

Vermont Avenue Re-alignment Fund Voted

Work will be ready to proceed within the next few days on the improvement of Vermont avenue in the business district of Gardena, following an allocation of a total of \$21,700 of gasoline tax funds by the county board of supervisors.

Plans of the county road department call for relocating the rails of the Pacific Electric, and changing the grade of the street so that an awkward turn will be eliminated for auto and truck traffic in front of the bank building, according to county road engineers.

The improvement is to extend between 163rd street and Gardena boulevard, according to the resolution adopted by the board.

Distributor Highway Jobs Nearing Finish

Vital links are rapidly snapping up to round out the distributor highway encircling the Los Angeles metropolitan area. Two jobs will be finished early next month on this route which was recommended to accelerate the movement of thru-traffic and relieve congestion on local streets.

New pavement on Sepulveda boulevard, the west arm of the distributor highway, from Lincoln boulevard to Centinela avenue is expected to be completed about Mar. 13. Contract for grading and paving of another 1.8-mile strip of Sepulveda from Playa street to Washington boulevard has been awarded with the job scheduled to be completed by about July 24. A grading and 30-foot pavement project 1.8 miles on Corritos avenue, part of the eastern arm of the distributor highway, between Firestone boulevard and Telegraph road is slated to be opened by about Mar. 6.

New Gas Water Heaters Offered At Low Terms

Only Sales Tax Necessary to Get Latest Type of Appliances

A campaign to induce home owners in Southern California to install new automatic gas water heaters was launched this week by gas appliance dealers in cooperation with gas companies. Up to and including Apr. 30, special terms will be offered purchasers of new automatic gas water heaters. These terms, applying both to heaters with galvanized and Monel metal or Everdur tanks, will include no down payment, (except sales tax) payments spread over from 40 to 60 months, and a liberal trade-in allowance.

A Distinct Service

The only requirements as to type are that the heater must bear the approval of the American Gas Association testing laboratory, be equipped with a safety pilot and be installed with adherence to ordinances and plumbing regulations. Convinced that these liberal terms will make it possible for all gas users to modernize with continuous, automatic hot water service, dealers and gas company sales representatives feel that the campaign will render a distinct service to Southern California.


