12-Year-Old Twins Depict Prince, Pauper

As alike as two newly-coined pennies are Billy and Bobby Mauch, the 12-year-old twins who are fast adding stars to their crown in the entertainment world.

Already radio and stage stars when they were signed up by First National a little more than a year ago in order to get one of them for young "Anthony Adverse," they are now making their debut as a team on the screen in Mark Twain's well-remembered classic, "The Prince and the Pauper." Also a second feature "The Hit Parade" with all the stars of screen and radio.

Speed Plans for New Theatre in Redondo

The plans for the new theatre building at the corner of Torrance boulevard and South Catalina street in Redondo Beach, to be erected by the Pacific States Theatres, Inc., are being rushed to completion.

The erection of the theatre will commence about July 15, and will be finished on or about Oct. 15.

The theatre will be of modern design and acoustically treated so that the sound, with the wide range screen will be the last word and be as perfect as any in existence. The projection booth will contain the latest type of equipment.

The auditorium of the theatre will be roomy and of sufficient size to house 900 seats, with comfortable space between rows, and will have two small stores in the building.

fortunate doubles were required to spend long hours listening to recordings of the real stars, watching interminable action shots and practicing walking, singing and other mannerisms.

The fanaticism and intolerance of certain dwellers in remote hill-countries of the United States are revealed in "Mountain Justice," the First National melodrama which will be one of the feature attractions at the Torrance theatre Saturday. This thrilling picture, which is not alone a dramatic sociological document, but a tender romance, co-stars Josephine Hutchinson and George Brent. Miss Hutchinson portrays Ruth Harkins, a young mountaineer girl who has a taste of life and education in the "outside" and returns to her hamlet eager to bring health and education to at least the children of the backwoods. Her one sympathizer and aide in this is Guy Kibbee, a genial old physician. Her worst enemy and opponent is her own father, played

by Robert Barrat, a bitter fanatic who hates everything taught by "furriners." Things come to such a pass that the elder daughter, Miss Hutchinson, in a fight for her own life is obliged to kill her father. George Brent, a brilliant young attorney who has met

her in New York and learns to love her, comes to her rescue and defends her at her trial for murder. But there is not even justice in this ignorant region, and she is convicted and sentenced to a long term in prison. By a thrilling stratagem, she is removed from the prison and flown to another state, whose governor refuses to grant extradition papers, so she remains free.

Star Doubles Star in Picture


