The words of the Psalmist, "The truth of the Lord endureth for ever. Praise ye the Lord," are the Golden Text in the Lesson—Sermon on "Truth" on Sunday in all Christian Science Churches, branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts.

The Lesson—Sermon includes these Scriptural verses from the Gospel of John: "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father) full of grace and truth. . . . And of his fulness have all we received, and grace for grace. For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ."

Among the correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, are the words: "The Word was made flesh. Divine Truth must be known by its effects on the body as well as on the mind, before the Science of being can be demonstrated. Hence its embodiment in the incarnate Jesus,—that life-link forming the connection through which the real reaches the unreal. Soul relieves sense, and Truth destroys error."

The array of gifts will be displayed next week in Sam Levy's store window and these include a Koper gas range, G. E. radio, floor lamp and other valuable awards.

The team disposing of the most tickets will be treated to a dinner and theatre party, according to Harry McManus, general chairman of the barbecue. All funds derived from the event will be added to the building fund for a new church here, Rev. Father Joseph Fitzgerald states.
