FOUR ENTER HOSPITAL

MEREDITH NUGENT . . . one-time noted illustrator and art instructor, passed away suddenly August 30 at the age of 77 at his home, 505 West Ocean boulevard in Long Beach. As a young man, Mr. Nugent studied art in Paris and the Latin quarter of the French capital was his home during his student years.

His works appeared in St. Nicholas, Century, Harper's and the Ladies Home Journal a generation ago. Moving to Los Angeles in 1907, he taught art in the high schools and his last assignment was at Narbonne, where he taught from 1922 to 1934, beginning in the old school on Narbonne Avenue.

Since 1934, Mr. Nugent lived on West Ocean boulevard. A crematory funeral service was held at the Mottell Mortuary last Thursday afternoon. Mr. Nugent was survived by a sister and a nephew.
