

Market prices may be expected to advance slightly as soon as local home-grown supplies are exhausted. A further adjustment between eastern and mid-western city prices appears likely, also, in that the prices in the east are now lower than those in the west, in contrast to the usual relationship.

Races Will Be

fame. Assisted by members of Bert S. Crossland post, American Legion, he will send the boys away on their speed rushes in rapid order. The route will be patrolled by Legionnaires and other adults.

Local police officers will block off the course on Hawthorne avenue and no automobiles will be permitted to travel on it during the races. There are no intersecting streets or roads along the half-mile "track." Because the starting line has been fixed at the top of the descent, no pushing will be allowed. The racers will take off from a standing start.

Prize-Fund Raised
City Judge Robert Lessing, chairman of the Harbor District Soap Box Derby, will be general chairman for the Torrance-Walteria boys' race events. The Lomita, Harbor City, Gardena and Compton boys will have their own race officials or may use the Torrance men.

At the finish line there will be as many judges as there are boys in each heat, thus permitting each judge to pick a different winner according to how the boys cross the line. Michael Strasser will serve as clerk of the course.
Cash donations from various service clubs, American Legion, Chamber of Commerce and other groups have been received for the prize fund and the awards will be purchased out of this money. There will be four prizes awarded to Torrance-Walteria winners. It is understood that the boys competing from Lomita, Harbor City, Gardena and Compton will have their own array of individual community prizes.

Expert Tells How
To Avoid Motor
Lubrication Ills

Waste of motor oil, premature firing of gasoline, warping and sticking of valves, undue wear on piston rings, loss of power and jerky, costly operation of an automobile engine can often be prevented by a very simple process, according to H. A. Benner of New York.

"Primary cause of these automotive troubles," declares Benner, "is motor-overheating. Deadly enemy of motors, which prevents accurate registering of the heat gauge and causes a long chain of over-heating troubles, is rust. This just accumulates on the lining of the water jacket. When it has grown to the depth of one-eighth inch it is as difficult for the cooling elements to penetrate as though it were a solid inch of steel plate.

"Elimination of rust and prevention of its future formation is quickly and easily achieved through proper flushing, with a special flushing element, followed by the use of a water neutralizer. To keep cars at peak efficiency, water cooling systems should be flushed and water neutralized at regular intervals."
