NORTHWEST PASSAGE by Kenneth L. Roberts

The central figure of this story is little known, but historically true, Robert Rogers—American ranger, scout, explorer, Indian fighter and the most skillful commander of Colonial Rangers during the French and Indian wars. He led the almost miraculous expedition against the Indian settlement of St. Francis in 1759, but his dream was to find an overland passage to the Pacific.

The narrator of the story is Langdon Towne whose ambitions were to paint the Indians as they really looked and to follow Rogers. The book is captivating for when you finish you will have the sense, not of having read a good historical novel, but of having actually lived through the stormy days of our French and Indian Wars. There is flavor in the story, in the full meaning of the word.

LIFE WITH MOTHER by Clarence Day: Readers of Clarence Day's "Life With Father" will not have to be told that this, a further chronicle of the "red headed Day family" is a delectable book. Indeed, despite the title, Father holds the center of the stage still, and by his robust personality dominates the book as he did the Family.

But Mother holds her own. Mother had a way with her and usually, too, she got her way. Here are the same fine characterizations, the gentle wit, the vigorous good sense combined with gaiety that made "Life With Father" one of the most loved books of our time.

LANCER AT LARGE by Francis Yeats Brown:

The author of that widely read "Lives of a Bengal Lancer," which also made a remarkable motion picture, has revisited India after an absence of 15 years. He writes with sympathy and authority of the life in India. This is a thoroughly entertaining book, full of meaty commentary.

To some, his accounts of Hindu mysticism and Yogi practices will be of particular interest. The chapters on social and economic conditions, education, sanitation, medical care are written with first rate powers of observation and sympathetic understanding.


