## Unemployed Who Expect State Aid Must Register for Work

California unemployed workers who have made contributions to the Unemployed Trust Fund are asked to register for work at the office of the California State Employment Service nearest their home. This request, according to John S. Horn, member of the Unemployment Reserves Commission, was made to insure prompt payment of unemployment benefits to this group of workers after Jan. 1.

Horn pointed out that the Unemployment Reserves Act requires an individual to apply for work before he is permitted to apply for unemployment compensation. Immediately after making application for work, the C.S.E.S. will make every effort to place the individual in gainful employment. No benefits are paid, of course, while an individual is in gainful employment.

"The Commission anticipates at least 50,000 persons will apply for benefits on Monday, Jan. 3," Horn said. "We have only 62 California State Employment Service offices throughout the state and our working staff is less than a thousand persons."

A fair-sized audience gathered last Thursday evening to hear a speaker, new to Torrance, John Jennings of Los Angeles. His speech was immensely enjoyed by all, putting forth the Townsend plan in a new light—"the brotherhood of man."

We were glad to welcome Mr. and Mrs. Fred Wagner again who as usual were ready with cheery reports from the firing line. Mrs. French reported that many inquiries are received and new members gained from the ranks of the A. F. of L. and C. I. O., who are eager to know what bearing the Townsend plan may have on their unions.

Jennings' address took up national problems, holding them to view in a new light from what most speakers use—the light of that unerring analyst—history. In part he said: The security of any nation lies in three great factors of well-being, physical, economical and spiritual. These factors must be kept in balance. Two factors must not over-top the third—all must be in balance.

"In the light of history let us look at a very few of our own problems. Have we in America, physical, economical and spiritual security? Are these three out of balance? We know they are! Then let us shut our eyes to the hand-writing on the wall. Let's quit being hard and indifferent about the future of our beloved America; let's think more about the 37 millions of 'tax-eaters' here leaning on us. Let us look about and realize the suffering of millions—poor, cold, hungry and thus we may help to usher in the first glimmer of that dawn of a new civilization called—"The Brotherhood of Man."
