## Bishop Stevens Here Sunday

The Rt. Rev. W. Bertrand Stevens D. D., Bishop of the Diocese of Los Angeles, will speak on the Oxford and Edinburgh Conferences at St. Andrew's Episcopal church, Sunday morning at 11 o'clock. Church historians have pronounced the discussions held and conclusions reached at both Oxford and Edinburgh as the most significant developments in Christendom since the Reformation.

The Oxford Conference considered the problem of the modern state and the church and the purpose of the Edinburgh Conference was to find a theological basis for church unity. Bishop Stevens was an active delegate at both gatherings. Since his return to Los Angeles he has spoken throughout Southern California on his experiences of last summer. Citizens of Torrance as well as members of the Episcopal church are invited to hear him speak.

**State Tax Aid**

The state law requires filing on or before April 15 if: Single, net income of \$1,000 or more; married (living with husband or wife), net income of \$2,500 or more, or a gross income of \$5,000 or more.
