The Rt. Rev. Robert B. Gooden D. D., Suffragan Bishop of Los Angeles, will conduct a confirmation service at St. Andrew's Episcopal church next Sunday morning at 11 a. m. The class will be presented to Bishop Gooden by Rev. Thomas R. Marshall, vicar of the local church. There will be 38 candidates for confirmation of which 20 are adults, two are college students, and 16 are students in Torrance and Lomita schools.

Keystone Fights Flood Ruling

The Keystone Chamber of Commerce favors a move by county authorities to prevent any further subdivision in the low areas of that community until drainage problems are solved but is emphatically opposed to any "blanket edict" aimed at all individual land transactions throughout the community.

The chamber met this week to take action against a recent ruling that all real estate sales permits in the Keystone area be held up pending investigation of flood conditions, according to Secretary S. C. Sault. He reported that he had received information that the real estate commissioners' office had been instructed to make a thorough study of any real estate transaction in Keystone before approving it.

This move was assertedly taken as a means of preventing further building in the Keystone lowlands, menaced by flood waters, leaders in that community were informed. Meanwhile, Keystoneers are still fighting for action on their proposal that \$113,000 worth of drainage work be done there to take care of flood waters.

Sault reported that county authorities who reported receiving a \$1,000,000 drainage project, a plan which would be impossible to realize for many years to come, insist Keystone land is subject to tidal action from the ocean. This, if true, means that the area would be practically impossible to drain.

The chamber secretary declared this week that the civic group is now assembling data to prove that action does not affect their land.

Also flood conditions in Keystone at the present time are not nearly as serious as they were during last year's high water, many acres of the lowest land are under water. No homes or highways are imperiled as yet by the flood drainage.
