Film Tribute To Pioneers

The story of America's "Life-line of Empire," the Wells Fargo Trail, first highway to connect the East and Far West, forms the dramatic background for "Wells Fargo," the screen romance with Joel McCrea, Frances Dee and Bob Burns which opens Sunday at the Torrance theatre.

Painted on an heroic canvas, "Wells Fargo" traces the history of the opening of the West from the time of the discovery of gold at Sutter's Mill until the close of the War Between the States, with the express business of Henry Wells and William Fargo, which has developed into today's Railway Express Agency, forming the background.

For romance the picture follows the love story of a typical Western family, headed by McCrea and Miss Dee, who are married at the beginning of the picture. Their fortunes, closely linked with the expansion of the Wells Fargo business and the winning of the West, form the main theme of the picture.

In producing "Wells Fargo" it was the purpose of Paramount Pictures to pay tribute to the expression who played such an important part in the American history. These men were the first on the scene when gold was discovered in California, to carry news and supplies into remote mining camps and "diggings" and, on the return shipment to the East, the dangers they encountered, from Indians, bandits and Nature, supply the picture with inspirational appeal and thrills.

Around Hollywood Film Lots

HOLLYWOOD (U.P.)—If a man in Kalamazoo, Mich., opened a store to sell fighting tarantulas, black widow spiders and other ilk he would probably land in a padded cell, but in Hollywood his occupation would not be considered "unusual."

The cinema capital is crowded with people who make a living by supplying oddities to the movies. No one considers them or their work out of the ordinary. The man who sits next to you in the movies or shops at the same market may be a world's authority on centipedes with a large stock of insects as his means of living.

Among the unusual experts in Hollywood is S. W. Allman, who trains snakes and bugs. His tarantulas bring \$10 a day each and large snakes are as high as \$50 a day—including lunch for the snake if it is rented during one of the reptile's quarterly mealtimes.

J. C. Chalmers specializes in making various "props" which can be eaten. In RKO-Radio's picture, "Radio City Revels," the script called for a goat to eat several packages of lead pencils. Chalmers moulded the pencils from sugars and other material that would appeal to the goat's appetite. After the first sample nibble, the goat eagerly gulped down package after package of pencils. Chalmers is especially proud of his shoe strings and cocktail glasses which may be consumed for comedy effect.

Earl Hayes prints newspapers for the movies. Frequently a newspaper is an important part of a movie's action. Hayes has a complete printshop and sets up an entire front page containing whatever material the studio wants printed. He also has a large research library which enables him to duplicate newspapers of the past.

Lionel Comport makes his living by training mules to buck at \$25 a buck for the first guarantee buck and \$10 each thereafter. The guaranteed buck is supplied at a specified cue, and no misses are promised by Comport. The mule trainer, however, has a stand-by mule for emergencies who can pinch-hit for the guaranteed buck in event that the star becomes temperamental.
