## Steelworker Joe La Fond Boasts of Four Living Generations

The proud-looking gentleman holding the baby is Joe LaFond of the Electrical Dept. at the Columbia Steel plant, who boasts of being a great grandfather.

The lady on the right is his daughter, Mrs. Florence Grist of Montreal, Canada, who is visiting with Joe at the present time. The young man on the left is his grandson, Reginald Grist, and the baby that Joe is holding is his great grandson, Douglas Grist, 10 months old.

Joe, who is quite a familiar figure in the plant, was educated in the schools of Montreal, Canada. After leaving school he took up boxing as a career, and fought under the name of Joe Costello for 10 years. During that time he had 103 fights,

with 47 knockouts to his credit, and he does not feel at all ashamed when he tells you that during his ten years of fighting he was only knocked out six times.

In 1902, he decided to give up boxing, and joined the police force in Montreal. Joe has many interesting stories of his experiences while being a member of the Montreal force.
