**BOCK BEER SURE SIGN OF SPRING**

Thirty-five California breweries tendered an early welcome to Spring on this St. Patrick's morning when the short season for Bock Beer officially opened throughout the state. The Bock Beer season has nothing in common with the ancient idea of March, nor is it the time when goats go on a regular rampage.

According to J. S. Foto, vice-president of the Aemo Brewing company, one embattled goat actually did go on a rampage in Germany some centuries ago. Two Hansatic noblemen were in the act of holding a drinking contest with the historic Spring brew when the goat charged across the palace patio, upset all traditions and one of the nobles. From that unceremonious "booking" dates the origin of Bock Beer—so 'tis said.

"Some historians," says Foto, "trace the dark brew back to antiquity and to Freya, goddess of the fertility of the soil, to whom the ancients offered libations in beer at the spring of the year. Another version places its origin in Einbeck, Germany, some 700 years ago. This city became so celebrated
