City's Share of Liquor Fees Is \$861

Cities and unincorporated areas in Los Angeles county will receive a total of \$323,173.19 as their share of fees derived from liquor licenses during the last half of 1937. On the basis of actual licenses issued, Torrance will receive \$861.77.

From the standpoint of the state as a whole, the allocation will amount to \$991,962.

33. This represents 50 percent of the total fees earned during the last six-months period of 1937. The state's share of this income, after administration costs are deducted, goes into the general fund.
