Modern Concepts of Education Provide for Personal Studies

(EDITOR'S NOTE: In the last issue of the Los Angeles School Journal there appeared an article by Principal Thomas Elson of Torrance high school which contained a statement of principles regarding education as practiced in the local school. With Principal Elson's permission, this article is hereby reproduced in "The Herald" to acquaint parents with some little-known facts about "guidance work," an integral part of education today.)

As we view it, under modern concepts of education, the guidance function of the classroom teacher is inseparable from that of instruction.
The function of the classroom teacher under modern concepts of education is essentially guidance.

Curriculum making, the planning and carrying on of classroom activities are joint pupil-teacher enterprises. Growth and guidance are co-partners.

The teacher so directs the program that the needs of the individual are served.
In order to realize this purpose he secures all possible information concerning the individual.

The attitude of the teacher is that of a friendly guide who invites and keeps confidences and studies his pupils to discover needs.

The classroom teacher in his guidance work has access to the following sources of information: his own pupil record; his own pupil record including reading habits, test records, personality trait chart, autobiographical sketches and study habits.

The teacher may also consult the cumulative record in the counselor's office; adjustment committee data (case studies on social maladjustment); vocational guidance conference reports and Junior High school orientation data.

The guidance program of a classroom teacher is carried out through the following activities:

1. Pupil-Teacher Conferences. Conferences on personal problems are one of the most effective means of guidance available to the classroom teacher.

The pupil-sought conference arises out of the learning situation as an anticipated outcome of the planning of the teacher.

The teacher-sought conference is arranged to meet a need revealed by the pupil in the learning situation.

Conferences are held during teacher-free time, during class time, or are pre-arranged outside of school schedule.

2. Group Activities. Group guidance includes: special sessions of the class on topics which promote vocational, educational and social guidance.

3. Class Organization. The organization scheme of the class promotes guidance objectives, as for example, class committee assignments include committees whose purpose is to evaluate class activities as to the furtherance of educational, vocational and social ends.

4. Outside Reports. The appearance before the class of graduates and upper class students for the purpose of giving counsel based upon their own experiences. The need arises out of class discussions.

5. Classroom Libraries. Classroom deposits of inspirational reading material having guidance values are available, under regulation, during class sessions.

6. Explanatory Features. Each class is conducted with the explanatory idea in mind.

7. Special Subjects. In various special subject classes as shop, home economics, com-

merce, art, music, guidance is an organic part of the instructional program, generally this is vocational guidance, but, to a lesser degree, is social and educational guidance.

8. Vocational Conferences are arranged for all expressed group interests, the leader brought in from the community.

9. Occupational Orientation. Students are "farmed out" to business and industrial organizations to secure first hand experience, or, are assigned to simple research problems in the fields of business, industry, and professions. Their reports make part of the vocational conference records.

10. Excursions. In response to group interests discovered in the classroom, field excursions and visitations are arranged.

Supplementing the extensive betterment program completed in this district last year, Southern California Gas company will spend in excess of \$250,000 for additional improvements and extensions to its natural gas system in the Compton-Redondo area during 1938, according to J.
