

# Louie Wins Mile Again

(We might as well save this 'head' for use weekly until track season is over!)

All the sports dopsters had Louie Zamperini running his heart out to beat Sadaj of California who was leading by about 40 yards when the anchor lap of the medley relay began last Saturday night at the West Coast relay carnival in Fresno. That was the dope before the race.

Actually, Zamperini's co-workers from U.S.C. furnished him with a lead of about 25 yards when the last lap—the mile—started. And Louie stretched that lead into 100 yards to the race.

## BROKE RECORD FOUR YEARS AGO

It was on May 21, 1934—four years ago next Saturday—that Louie Zamperini first shot into prominence as a rising track star. On that day at the L. A. Coliseum he set a new world's high school record in the mile of 4:21.3. Eleven days later, also at the Coliseum, he ran his first 1,500 meter race and, against college competition, won in four minutes flat.

May Run Two Races  
He broke Ralph Hill's mark of 4:12.6 but the Torrance ace's mark cannot be another record for him because he had a running start. The Fresno meet was a walkaway for the boys from U.S.C. They rolled up 7 1/2 points to spread-eagle the field and prove they compose the best track team in the nation.

Friday night Louie Zamperini will be seen in action against his arch-rival Don Lash of Indiana in the Compton Junior College invitational meet. He is definitely programmed to run the 1,500 meter race and he has told friends here that if he feels good, he'll enter the 800 meter (Continued on Page 6-B)

## Kiwanis and Key Clubs Sponsor Sports Nite Show Here June 3

### TICKETS NOW ON SALE FOR EVENT IN MUNICIPAL PARK

Arrangements are being made by the Torrance Kiwanis and high school Key clubs to stage one of the most elaborate Sports Nite open-air entertainments ever presented in the Harbor district Friday night, June 3, at the city park's ball field. Many different forms of sport will be exhibited during the two and one-half hour show, tickets for which went on sale today.

All members of the sponsoring Kiwanis and Key clubs have supplies of the duets, which are selling for 40 cents for adults, 25 cents for students. The net proceeds from the Sports Nite entertainment will be divided between the Kiwanians' Under-Privileged Children's fund and the Key clubbers' fund to pay for new track suits for Torrance high athletes.

The program will include boxing and wrestling bouts, exhibitions of jiu jitsu and kendo (Japanese fencing), roping, tumbling and there will be various kinds of races and several comedy acts. The Torrance Municipal band has agreed to play during the evening.

### Trophies for Winners

Robert L. Deiminger is general chairman of the Sports Nite. With the assistance of Henry Pupkoff and Reggie Treloar of the Key club, the Kiwanians have been assured that top-notch athletes from Torrance, Gardena and Inglewood high schools will participate as well as a score or more of other unattached sportsmen who excel in their various games.

High school students here and in Gardena are also selling tickets for the entertainment. The advance ticket selling campaign is under the direction of Dean Sears, while E. E. Murchison is arranging the program. Other Kiwanians who head special committees for the benefit show are: Howard Locke, concessions; Dr. W. I. Laughon, medical; Leonard Young, field; Jack Miller, grounds; Attorney John E. McCall, legal.

Suitable trophies are to be presented winners in the various bouts and exhibitions by the Kiwanis and Key clubs. Principal Thomas Elson of the local high school has endorsed the Sports Nite event and is cooperating with the two clubs in all preliminary arrangements for the June 3 entertainment.


