 President U. S. Grant, again confirming the title. The San Pedro Patent, giving title to the Dominguez, Rocha and Aguirra families, was signed by President James Buchanan December 28, 1869.

Value is Estimated  
 Should the Department of Interior now rule in favor of the applicants for oil leases, the state's oil industry would suffer a tremendous blow, for it would mean not only seizure of remaining oil but an accounting for all taken from the ground in the past.

Already 646,000,000 barrels of oil have been taken from the four fields involved, and reserves still in the ground are estimated at 405,000,000 barrels. On the present price basis, the value of oil that has been produced is \$710,000,000, while reserves have a value of \$445,500,000.

## AROUND HOLLYWOOD FILM LOTS

HOLLYWOOD (U.P.)—Barbara O'Neil has no patience with Hollywood actors who go around bemoaning their inability to return to the stage because of film contracts that tie them here.

"If these stars would mean what they say, they could take advantage of opportunities for a return to the stage that exists in Santa Barbara and Pasadena, both places only a few hours' drive from Hollywood," she declared.

Miss O'Neil pointed out that she returned to the stage last summer at Santa Barbara in Noel Conrad's "The Astonished Heart" and with Walter Huston in "Miles of Heaven."

At the moment she is playing the role of Louise Rainer's elder sister in Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's "The Toy Wife."

"At Santa Barbara or Pasadena, if not right here in Hollywood or Los Angeles, an actor can regain his stage feeling without going back to New York," she said.

"The fine part of it is that you gain experience with none of the dangers of appearing in a flop, on Broadway. For the audiences are small and if the play is a flop it won't be broadcast to the ends of the earth, as would be the case on Broadway. In some respects Santa Barbara has the greatest advantage in that it's a four-hour drive from Hollywood and there is less of a film colony turnout there."

"The advantages of appearing in a successful new play in Santa Barbara are no less than in any eastern tryout town," she pointed out. "If the play is a hit at Santa Barbara, it usually is taken to San Francisco for approval of the sophisticated audiences there and then it is brought to Los Angeles for the movie colony and the agents to view. By that time it is ready to go to New York for its Broadway run."

Animal fanciers will have a heyday during the gay Central Park Zoo scene in "Doctor Rhythm," which opens tonight at the Torrance theatre. Not only was the famous New York zoo reconstructed down to the last bar on the last lion's cage, but one of the most ambitious collections of trained animals in screen history was assembled for the occasion.

In the collection are six lions, three leopards, six bears, two hyenas, one elephant, a tiger, a camel, a zebra, a llama, a chimpanzee, twenty monkeys, six trained seals, a twelve-foot python and an aviary of eighty birds. The animals are not only seen, but distinctly heard, as they join in the fun with Bing Crosby, Andy Devine, Charlie Moore and Sterling Holloway.

The chief feminine roles in "Doctor Rhythm" a story taken from O. Henry's tale about the physician who masqueraded as a policeman, are Beatrice Lillie, England's famed comedienne, Mary Carlisle, Bing's partner in "Double or Nothing," and Laura Hope Crews, expert portrayeur of scatter-brained society women.

## Steel Plants Await Shasta Dam Contract

All Pacific coast steel plants are awaiting award of the Shasta dam contract, on which bids were recently opened, to determine allocation of steel contracts.

According to the magazine Steel, the job will take 13,000 tons of reinforcing bars, 10,000 tons of structural shapes, 6,800 tons of plates for penstocks and 3,300 tons of tubing. Steel awards last week included 2,568 tons of reinforcing bars and 1,246 tons of shapes for Pacific Coast projects.

## Film Spectacle at Plaza Theatre
