

Had Students' Confidance
 Andrews lives at 1920 32nd street with his brother, E. C. Andrews, who is 77 years old. His father died when he was 90 so longevity is a characteristic of his family. The local instructor has two daughters, one in Westwood and the other living in Manhattan Beach, and a grandson.

As counsellor and confidante of hundreds of boys and girls attending high school here, Andrews, it is safe to say, had no equal. The youngsters took their problems of conduct, amusement, family life and outside interests to him, expressed themselves fully and received in return mature counsel based on a thorough understanding. Many a boy and girl found Andrews their "best friend" in high school and he is proud of having helped them in whatever way he could. No selection has been made as yet of his successor in the high

school print shop. Faculty members well know that doubtless a competent man will take his place in that department but graduates of the high school are quick to assert that "no one can take Mr. Andrews' place as a real friend that you could depend on always."

His years of printing instruction qualify him for these observations on education in general and printing-education in particular:

Trade Always Advancing
 "I'm convinced that the school authorities do not realize that printing work is one of the best ways to capture a child's interest and teach him to be mentally alert while playing.

"Youngsters—boys and girls alike—enjoy the school print shop. There are a thousand different problems they can solve by working there with their heads and their hands.

"The printing trade is always advancing. New developments are constantly being introduced and it won't be very long before printing as we know it today will be obsolete. Setting type, even with the linotype and intertype machines, is too costly and already there are examples of new methods which eliminate this expense."
