Legion Conclave Plans Complete; Starts Sept. 19

LOS ANGELES (U.P.)—Plans for the entertainment of more than 140,000 American Legionnaires and their families at the 20th annual convention to be held here Sept. 19 to 22, have been completed.

The 12-hour-long parade, a feature of the gathering, will skip the congested downtown district entirely, and will be routed from Washington boulevard to the Coliseum, seating 110,000 persons.

The program gets under way Sept. 18, when the annual Fidae breakfast takes place, with Mrs. R. Alfred Blackburn of Kentucky, American vice president, in charge. France will be the honored country.

During the afternoon, a polo game has been arranged between famous stars, and a team composed of Legionnaires, at the Will Rogers Memorial Field.

Religious and patriotic services will be conducted Sunday night in the Hollywood Bowl, seating 25,000 persons. Only those who have registration tickets will be admitted.

Movie Stars in Pageant

Scores of film stars, under the direction of W. S. Van Dyke, already are rehearsing the spectacle. Herbert Marshall, English actor, will present a pageant, "The Birth of the American Legion." Fay Bainter, Gene Raymond and Pat O'Brien will take part in the play, "The Golden Lady," a tribute to Gold Star mothers. Nelson Eddy and Bing Crosby will contribute patriotic numbers.

On Monday, the American Legion auxiliary will begin its sessions in the Shrine Auditorium. Throughout the day, the drum and bugle corps will go through their preliminary competition in the Coliseum.

The Warner Brothers studios at Burbank will be thrown open to visitors during the afternoon, where the Legionnaires can see the inner workings of motion pictures.

The drum and bugle corps championship will be decided Monday night in the Coliseum before 110,000 persons. At the same hour, the National Commander's dinner will be held, with Jack Benny as master of ceremonies.

Tuesday is officially parade day, with no convention sessions scheduled. Present plans call for a 12-hour stream of marchers to circle the Coliseum. The California contingent will bring up the rear of the parade with a pageant of early days.

Tuesday night a boxing show is planned at Gilmore Stadium, with such notables present as Henry Armstrong and Ceterino Garcia. Also, veterans of the aviation corps and present-day fliers will assemble that night at Palomar Ballroom to choose "Miss American Legion."

Convention sessions will be resumed Wednesday, with scenic tours planned for the families.

Says City Needs More Firemen

Torrance needs a fire department of 21 or 22 regular paid firemen, in the opinion of C. M. Lockhard, former assistant fire chief of Alhambra, who is now conducting nightly classes in fire prevention work here under the direction of the state department of education.

Lockhard made his observation following a survey of the city to a group of local residents called to meet the instructor by John Stroh, director of the public safety department. The instructor declared that the volunteer fire force was exceptionally well qualified but with a city the size of Torrance more regular men should be employed to provide proper fire insurance.

Director Stroh said that he would not request enlarging the department until he had completed a more thorough survey of the city. At the present time there are four paid firemen on duty daily and there are 10 volunteers here and six in Welteria.

Dog Licenses Must be Paid Sept. 1 to Escape Penalty

Next Thursday, Sept. 1, is the deadline for payment of dog licenses and no 60-day grace period will be allowed without penalty. Last week The Herald erroneously reported such an extension of time. The penalty will be an extra 50 cents.

Dog owners should affix the license tags to their animals' collars immediately after obtaining the brass emblems because the mere fact that the license has been paid is no claim for exemption from capture if animals are found at large without the tags.

The South Bay Humane Society, which holds the pound contract here, states that the animal quarantine is still in effect and all animals found running the streets will be impounded regardless of whether or not they bear license tags. The impounded animals are held five days to permit claim. After that period they are destroyed at the Society's shelter, corner of Spencer and Earl streets. The telephone number there is Redondo 8100.

Council Moves to Aid Alondra Park

In adopting a resolution Tuesday night urging the county board of supervisors to refinance the Alondra Park acquisition and improvement (Mattoon Act) district, the city council indicated it was in sympathy with the efforts of North Torrance residents to clear their property of the "sour bond debt" incurred as result of the Mattoon Act.

The resolution called on the supervisors to "let the owners in that district obtain a merchantable title to their property by appropriate means." At a meeting late last week in North Redondo, Alondra Park residents urged Supervisor Leland Ford to work for lifting the "sour bonds" off their property.

Highway Work Cost Surprises City Council

A report from the State Highway department that more than \$6,500 has been spent during the last fiscal year on Highway 101 inside the Torrance city limits drew considerable comment from members of the city council in session Tuesday night.

"That's a lot of money for two miles of maintenance," declared the councilman in expressing the consensus. Leonard Young, acting city engineer, reported that the high expense was caused by the clean-up following the storms of last March. The cost comes out of the city's share of the state gasoline tax which is "ear-marked" for street maintenance work.
