Window-Crashing Burglars Caught by Local Police

(Continued from Page 1-A) which were recorded by police led to their detection.

On the morning of Aug. 24 they robbed the Redondo Beach jewelry store by the same window-breaking tactics. A few minutes later Hermosa Beach police officers saw the men and drove their patrol car toward them to question them. Poole and Evans fled, driving on the wrong side of the streets, breaking boulevard stops while the pursuing officers fired three shots at them. Finally they were trapped in a dead-end street. Taken to the Hermosa police station they were charged with 10 traffic violations. Investigation of their car disclosed an empty watch carton but Poole explained it belonged to a watch owned by his sister and they were allowed their freedom on their "own recognizance."

Dumped Loot in Sea A few hours later a Hermosa youngster reported to police there that he had found a watch and a bracelet beside a street. Calling the sheriff's office to find out if any jewelry stores had been robbed, the Hermosa officers were informed of the Torrance burglary. Alden Smith could not identify the recovered watch and bracelet but Officers Percy Bennett and William Evans, with Deputy Sheriff John Alder, began a search for the Wilmington suspects.

Evans was the first to be apprehended last Friday and his fingerprints checked with those found at the local store, according to Director Stroh. Then Poole was brought in and they confessed. Stroh said that the men asserted they had gone to Poole's home immediately after their arrest in Hermosa Beach and had taken the loot from Howard's store to a nearby pier. There they tossed the stuff into the ocean.

Evans, who is said to have a previous criminal record, and Poole were separated shortly after they were questioned here. Poole being taken to the Redondo jail to await preliminary hearing. They are held in default of \$2,500 bail.

North Torrance Water Survey Being Made

A survey now in progress here has revived efforts of city officials and interested residents to provide better water service in North Torrance. The survey is being prepared by Taylor and Taylor, Los Angeles hydraulic engineering firm.

The findings will be incorporated in a map of the proposed distribution system which may become the basis for a request by the city for a PWA project. While approval of the survey is not a promise of action by the city, the mapping of a distribution system for North Torrance would place the city in a favorable position for future residential development in that section. Mayor William H. Tolson said. The last effort to create a municipal water district in North Torrance failed when the protests against the project, which would have cost about \$8,000, were greater than the requests for the district.
