P. V. RESERVOIR NEXT M. W. D. PROJECT
Big Basin Will Hold 325 Million Gallons

Bits are to be called for in the near future for the construction of the Palos Verdes reservoir, according to F. E. Weymouth, general manager of the Metropolitan Water District.

General Manager Weymouth said that the Board of Directors of the District had just recently authorized the purchase of the reservoir site, which is located in the Palos Verdes hills immediately south of the intersection of Palos Verdes Drive and Normandie avenue.

To be constructed at the south end of the Palos Verdes lateral, the reservoir will guarantee uninterrupted water service for Torrance, Compton, Long Beach and the Los Angeles harbor area in case of a break in the northern section of the giant Metropolitan Aqueduct distribution system.

Known as a "cut and fill" type of reservoir, the structure will be constructed in a natural basin in the hills. Approximately 1,800,000 cubic yards of earth will be excavated and 1,000,000 cubic yards of tightly compacted earth-fill will be placed in creating the reservoir, which will require about one year to build.


