TESTED RECIPE

Chocolate Butterfly Cakes 6 tablespoons sifted cake flour; 1/2 teaspoon double-acting baking powder; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 3/4 cup sifted sugar; 4 egg whites, stiffly beaten; 2 egg yolks, beaten until thick and lemon-colored; 1 teaspoon vanilla; 2 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted; 3/4 cup cream, whipped.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Fold sugar gradually into egg whites. Fold in egg yolks and vanilla. Fold in flour gradually. Then beat in chocolate, gently but thoroughly.
