

Claim Election Boards Unduly Delayed Vote

COUNTY VOTE FOUND UNUSUALLY HEAVY

Los Angeles county cast approximately a 73 percent vote in last week's general election, on the basis of semi-official returns.

This is considered a heavy vote when only state officers and state issues are involved. During presidential election years the percentage of ballots cast often exceeds 80 and sometimes 85 percent of the county's total registration.

Voters W. M. Kerr, under date of Nov. 4, four days before the election, asking that substitutions be made on election boards for the workers who attended the meeting. Kerr took no action on the request because, he said, no affidavits were presented to him in support of the charges.

"The Republican board members, according to our information, were told to refrain from offering the signature book to the voter until after the voter's name was checked on the register, and ample time given or challenged," Clark's letter stated. "This, it was pointedly brought out, was to delay voting."

It is our belief that such a meeting, called by leaders of a political party to influence members of their party on the election boards to the detriment of an opposing political party constitutes such conduct on the part of these leaders as to render all Republican members of the election boards in the 18th Congressional district subject to removal. Affidavits will be presented."

How to Obtain Score on Item 8, Above: Amount of Agreement on 10 Domestic Problems

There are six degrees of agreement. Draw a circle around the number opposite each degree of agreement that best approximates your own feeling about how much you agree or disagree on the following ten matters of your married life:

1 means "almost always agree."
2 means "usually agree."
3 means "frequently disagree."
4 means "often disagree."
5 means "always disagree."
6 means "never agree."

NOTE: An approximation of what your final score would be on the complete scale can be estimated by dividing the sum of the points you earn on the first eight items by 7 and adding the result to your score on the first eight. For example, if you made 40 points on the first eight items, divide 40 by 7, which gives you 6 (approximate). Add those 6 points to

your 46 score, which makes your total score 52.

In the complete Happiness Scores test of the 732 couples tested in the experiment, the husband's average score was 68; the wife's 69. You can gather from this what your own score means. If it is above 44, it is probably a fairly successful marriage; but below 40, it can hardly be a happy marriage.
