



HAM AND EGG NEST

 2 slices buttered bread
 2 eggs
 Cut slices of bread thick. Hollow out the center. Brush with melted butter. Place ham on pan. Cover with buttered bread. Place in hot broiler and cook until egg is congealed.

HONEY DIPPED BAKED HAM
 1 Tender Made Ham
 1 cup strained honey
 Whole cloves
 Marshachino cherries
 Place whole or half Tender Made Ham, fat side up, on a rack in an open roasting pan. Heat in a moderately hot oven 325° to 350° for only five minutes to the pound. After the ham has been in the oven for the allotted time, five minutes to the pound, remove and garnish by scoring fat in two inch squares. Cover with honey. Dot with cloves and marshachino cherries. Return to oven which has been brought to broiling heat for approximately 5 to 10 minutes to set the decorations.

Put on platter, garnish with pineapple rings and cherries in center. Place parsley between the rings.

Feather-light Dumplings
 1 cup sifted flour; 1/4 teaspoon double-acting baking powder; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon melted butter; 3/4 cup milk.
 Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Add butter to milk; add to flour and stir carefully until all flour is dampened and soft dough is formed. Drop from teaspoon on boiling stew; cover very lightly and cook, without removing cover, 5 to 7 minutes according to size of dumplings. Serves 6 to 8.

(Continued from Page 1) as secretary. Stevens said yesterday that he had no idea when the commission will meet but believed a session would be called shortly after Chairman Bishop arrives home.

Alto Capt. Stevenson publicly announced that he was "satisfied" with the shake-up in the fire department after Stroh had been placed in charge of that unit and the police force, he considered fighting the demotion on civil service grounds.

Up to Board Now
 However, it is understood that an advice of legal counsel he gave up this plan. Since then he and Fireman Benner had their entanglement. The cause of their dispute is not known although several who claim "he in the know" assert that it involves matters outside of fire department work.

Director Stroh did not specify details concerning the Stevenson-Benner fisticuffs but indicated that he was more concerned over their failure to remain on duty a full shift. He said the entire matter is now before the civil service board and "whatever it does will be alright" with him.
