"As I know that the district has been a social expense to the county, for hospitalization of patients, social work and charities, it is a county problem as well as a city one and I believe that if a representation were made to county authorities of conditions there we would soon get some action."

"However, this may not be necessary because I have been informed by men who have some responsibility in the Pueblo that they will clean it up. They say, in effect: 'Let's don't have any

more publicity about it and we will do the right thing.' To give them an opportunity to carry out their statements, I shall not ask our city council as yet to lend aid to a solution of this community problem," Rev. Lingensfelder concluded.

"These are: Special Delivery and sure immediate delivery of all mail as soon as it is received at the postoffice, and Special Handling, which provides the same attention to packages so labeled as first class mail at only a nominal extra charge."

Lomita Survey Service Starts for Mail Carrier

An official survey, on which the postoffice department will base approval or refusal of carrier service in Lomita, has been started by Postmaster Birda Paddock. The information is to be sent Washington early in January and Miss Paddock anticipates that it will lead the postal authorities to order the carrier service.

The survey will include a study of Lomita's population, building gains, miles of sidewalks and improved streets and other community information. Secretary H. H. Halliday of the Lomita Chamber of Commerce, will assist Miss Paddock in compiling the material. The postoffice is qualified for carrier service because of its gross postal receipts last year.

Previous requests have been fruitless because of lack of post-al business and insufficient side-walks. If the present survey still shows inadequate walks, mounted and bicycle routes are still a possibility, the postmaster stated.
