Old Sea Wreck Victim Found Off Redondo

What ship sank to Davy Jones' locker off the Redondo Beach pier many years ago?

That is the question whose answer is being sought by Roberta Magraudy and Denny O'Brien, both of the beach city, who discovered the sunken hull, apparently about 120 feet long, in the surf late last week.

Ribs and copper plating of the hull were found almost submerged in sand when the tide reached a particularly low point.

Miss Magraudy and O'Brien, who failed to find any mention of such a sunken vessel in Redondo Beach records, said they will attempt to recover sections of the hull, possibly the name plate or the ship's bell, when the tide again reaches a mean low.

Housing Act Held Solution of Low-Rental Problem

thorough study of the local projects, forwarded them to President Roosevelt for his signature permitting a Federal loan of 90 percent of the total investment, to be repaid in 60 years at 3 percent interest. The county's participation in these projects will be made possible by the sale of bonds to private investment equivalent to 10 percent of the total cost.

Isadore B. Dockweiler, chairman of the County Housing Authority, has stated that the largest project No. 3, planned by the County Housing Authority, which will be located in the Belvedere Area, will soon be forwarded to Washington for study. Members of the County Housing Authority met last week with social workers, educators, and other east side citizens interested in clearing some of the substandard housing areas in Belvedere, some of which are admitted by Washington authorities to be classified under the heading of slums.

For Workers' Families
Also under consideration is an additional project of 250 family dwelling units to be added to the Atlantic Boulevard Project

north of Long Beach. Surveys of the needs of that district show an acute shortage of modern, low rent housing for Navy personnel who have families and are in the lower brackets of Navy pay, also a demonstrated need for such housing to serve families of industrial workers in the lowest income bracket.

Melville Dozier, Jr., executive director of the County Housing Authority, stated that under the United States Housing Act of 1937, residence in these projects will be limited to families in the lowest income group, who cannot pay sufficient rent to cause private enterprise to build an adequate supply of decent, safe and sanitary dwellings for their use. The Act does not provide for housing indigents, families on relief, nor does it anticipate furnishing housing for families who are now residing in adequate standard types of residences.

Dozier stated that surveys have shown an acute shortage of decent, sanitary and safe dwellings for low income families. Private capital has not and admittedly cannot afford to construct such housing projects for

families in the lowest income bracket for the reason that the rental coming therefrom would not pay them for their original investment.

MANY ARCHITECTS TO DRAW HOUSING PLANS

Fifteen architects will be associated in preparation of plans for the three Los Angeles county housing projects for the unincorporated districts north of Long Beach, in Palms Verdes Hills and the old Belvedere district, it was announced yesterday.

Melville Dozier, Jr., executive secretary of the county authority, said that preliminary plans for the project proposed for the old Belvedere district, which has been given the new name of Maravilla at the suggestion of Mexican residents, were sent to Washington Monday for approval of engineers for the national housing authority.

Also sent to Washington were plans for a second project in North Long Beach, which would double the size of the first project. Tentative approval was given the first North Long Beach project and another project for the Palms Verdes Hills early in the month.

Five architects or firms have been assigned to each project, Dozier said. Walker and Eisen, architects who prepared the plans for the Torrance civic center buildings, will assist in the plans for the Maravilla project.

deeded to the state for non-payment of taxes. The school sites had been designated as park sites until such time as they may be needed for school purposes, and the association now is transferring them to the school district.

The move is being made to prevent the parcels from passing into private hands if the moratorium on the sale of tax-deeded property, which is to expire Jan. 31, is not extended by the 1939 Legislature. Most of the sites are adjacent to Malaga Cove.




