MRS. EMMA M. BISHOP... (mother of Dr. R. F. Bishop and J. O. Bishop of this city, succumbed suddenly Monday at Torrance Memorial hospital following a paralytic stroke. She had been ill only a short time. Mrs. Bishop, who was 69 years old, was born in Anita County, New York. With her husband and family, she came to California many years ago but later returned east.

For the past five and one-half years, Mrs. Bishop and her husband, Thomas J. Bishop, had been living at 1123 West 81st street, Los Angeles. She is also survived by two other sons, W. W.
