


Hitler Foresees His End; Gives Self Six Months To Two Years More!

DOLF HITLER, sitting high up in the political driver's seat in Europe today, feared as no man has been feared since Napoleon, makes the very foundation of his strength with these words: "My time is now short."



On One of These Peaks Overlooking the Town of Berchtesgaden in Bavaria, Hitler has Built His "Eagle's Nest" where He Goes to Plan Germany's Future and Ponder His Own Fate.

This startling disclosure is made in the April issue of Cosmopolitan magazine in an article by Karl H. von Wiegand, noted correspondent, called "Hitler Foresees His End!" The Führer, von Wiegand says, gives himself six months more, perhaps a year, at the most two years. And then... Hitler is already living in a retirement "Eagle's Nest" high in the Bavarian mountains, which many believe is his self-designed mausoleum.

Whether this presentation of impending disaster comes from a fear of death through illness or accident, or whether he foresees being overthrown by his enemies or even his own people, Hitler does not seem to care. He has committed himself to this: "Meine Zeit ist nun kurz." —The end of my mission in the world is nearing.

- 1. The necessary grading for widening of present pavement and extending of existing culvert at the southwest corner of 190th Street and Crenshaw Blvd. Estimated Excavation 225 cu. yds.
- 2. Provide and place 130 cu. yds. of Sand Cushion under new pavement.

ORDINANCE NO. 3318 (New Series)

An ordinance amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 217 (New Series) by amending subsection 34 thereof and by adding thereto subsections 75% and 126.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles do hereby amend Section A of Ordinance No. 217 (New Series), entitled "An ordinance providing for boulevard stops along certain portions of certain highways in the unincorporated territory of the County of Los Angeles and repealing ordinances Nos. 1386, 1414, 1439, and 1625 (New Series) adopted November 21, 1932, is hereby amended by amending subsection 34 thereof and by adding thereto two new subsections, to be subsections 75% and 126 thereof, each to read respectively as follows:

(34) CARLSON STREET (Torrance District). Each side of Carlson Street from Normandy Avenue to the boundary line of the City of Long Beach excepting at its intersection with Vermont Avenue and Alameda Street.

(75%) FIRMONA AVENUE (Lennox District). Each side of Firmona Avenue at its intersection with 10th Street.

(126) IMPERIAL HIGHWAY (Orange County District). Each side of Imperial Highway from Laitweiler Avenue to boundary line of the County of Orange.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption, and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from passage hereof shall be published for at least one week in Torrance Herald, a newspaper printed and published in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, together with the names of the members of the Board of Supervisors voting for and against the same.
