

Protect Your Children!

Tell Them To Use These Guarded Crossings On Way To School

Announcement of the hours and intersections where crossing guards will be placed for the protection of children going to and returning from school was made today by A. H. Tryon, superintendent of the Los Angeles Crossing Guard Department, under the direction of the sheriff's office.



"We urge mothers to cooperate with the local chief of police and school teachers in their effort to have children use these protected intersections," Superintendent Tryon stated to The Herald this week. "If they do this, we shall be able to maintain our record of only one child killed in seven years in the entire Los Angeles county where a crossing guard is present," he added.

Crossing guards for this area will be placed at the intersections listed in the accompanying chart beginning with the first day of school, Sept. 11. All guards are carefully chosen and fingerprinted. Supt. Tryon stated. Every guard is thoroughly instructed before he is engaged and only married men are used, over 99 percent of whom have children of their own, he added.

"Chancy Wright will be in charge of the work in this area, and both he and myself, as well as all other members of the crossing guard staff are anxious to cooperate with P. T. A. and other organizations," Superintendent Tryon emphasized.

ALL IN THE DAYS WORK
by Ida Tarbell: Miss Tarbell began her writing career in 1880 and has occupied a unique place in the field of American letters. Her "History of the Standard Oil Company" has been regarded since then as the authoritative study of the most important industrial movement of the time.

In her early days the economic problem was conflict between large and little interests and no one knew it better than Ida Tarbell brought up in the oil fields where monopoly had left hardship and devastation in its wake. "She championed a cause that to her was fundamentally American: the right of every individual to maintain his freedom as master of his own domain under the protection of a democratic government."

She told reporters on her 80th birthday that her autobiography was going to be "shop talk" but such shop talk.
