### LOWER ELECTRIC RATES GO INTO EFFECT MARCH 1

New, lower electric rates, providing savings of \$1,000,000 annually, largely to commercial and residential customers of Southern California Edison Co., were announced today by President Ray L. Riley of the California Railroad Commission. The new rates become effective March 1.

Since the charges for minimum use customers of this company are among the lowest in the state, it was found no further reduction to this class could equitably be made. Consequently, the largest savings are awarded in both the commercial and domestic adjustments to those using greater amounts of electricity.

Riley said the Commission expects to order a complete new revamping of rates for street lighting in the near future for the various municipalities served by the company.

Torrance and Lomita residential customers receive savings as high as 12.1 per cent, dependent upon the amount of electricity used. The following table compares the present monthly bills with those under the new rates for a number of different uses in kilowatt hours:

Commercial rates are reduced an average of 6.5 per cent, with the maximum saving, 9.8 per cent being earned by those customers using 1,000 kilowatt hours of electric energy per month. The following table compares the commercial customer's present bills with those under the new rates for a number of different monthly usages:

The orchestra's entire string ensemble will set the pace for the evening in presenting Bach's scintillating "Brandenburg Concerto," featuring the charm of singing strings in peerless counterpoint.

Beethoven's immortal Symphony No. 5 follows. Piastro will appear as guest soloist of the evening. His selection will be Paganini's Concerto in D Major. As an appealing finale, Johann Strauss' beloved "Blue Danube Waltz" will be played with authentic Viennese charm. Piastro, having studied in Vienna "in its other days," has paid particular attention to this number, and its lilting refrain will long linger with the audience.

### Civil Service Course Offered at Night School

In order to prepare the people of the community for Civil Service examinations and thus pave the way to jobs which are being opened to the public in Torrance, Los Angeles County, and the State and Federal governments, Principal C. B. Baldwin announces the addition of a coaching class in Civil Service being given at the Torrance Evening high school.

The course consists of tests and drills in arithmetic, spelling, grammatical usage, vocabulary building, and other fundamentals presented in the forms commonly used in Civil Service examinations. A study is made of the functions of the Federal, state, county and city governments, as well as the Los Angeles City Board of Education. Instruction is given in self-help, how to get a job, how to meet interviewers, and how to develop personality traits desirable in the employee in his relations with his employer, fellow workers, and the public. The course is a streamlining process adapted to adults who desire a rapid review of the fundamentals of education besides affording training for the non-technical parts of Civil Service examinations.

The Civil Service class meets from 7 to 9 o'clock on Mondays and Wednesdays.
