City Prepares for St. Improvement

Two resolutions, adopted by the city council Tuesday night, laid the groundwork for the eventual improvement of Terrace boulevard and Cabrillo avenue. One proposed the improvement of Cabrillo from Torrance boulevard to the east property line of Border avenue and the other authorized City Attorney John E. McCall to institute condemnation proceedings against the Pacific Electric Railway to obtain clear title to the P. E.'s center-strip right-of-way along Cabrillo.

The railway company has agreed to this "friendly suit" and also to the sale of the right-of-way to the city for \$8,055. The court decision is necessary in order to obtain a clear title to the property. The city will remove the tracks and overhead wiring system under supervision of the P. E.
