

Firestone Store Ransacked Here

Using the firm's own pick-up truck to carry off their loot, thieves ransacked the Firestone Tire and Service station at the corner of Marcellina and Cravens avenue last Thursday night, making off with merchandise valued at more than \$130, according to police reports.

The burglars entered the store thru the brake department building by forcing off a lock on a pair of iron gates by using a small steel bar, police said. Then they backed up the truck to the entrance, loaded on five radios, tennis rackets, household electrical appliances and other merchandise and drove off.

Police reported that the empty truck was later found on a vacant lot located at 130th street and Denker avenue.

Civil Service Law Is Under Fire


