War in Europe Cuts Insanity

SACRAMENTO (U.P.) — One effect of the war in Europe, so long as it does not actually involve the United States, will be a reduction of insanity in California, in the opinion of Dr. Aaron J. Rosanoff, state director of institutions.

Rosanoff pointed out that unemployment is on the decrease at the present time as the result of national defense activity. He said a reduction in admissions to the state's mental hospitals was recorded during the World War and he predicted a similar record in the present conflict.

The director said also he was "very sure that the increase in alcoholism during the last few years is tied in with unemployment."

Counting Our Trout To Benefit Anglers and Guide Planting

They're counting the trout in California lakes and streams for the benefit of anglers and as a guide to future trout plantings.

Sportsmen are asked to aid by reporting the number, size and species of trout with marked fins caught in the areas where the "census" checks are being made.

The count is being made jointly by the U. S. Forest Service, California State Division of Fish and Game, U. S. Bureau of Fisheries and the Reclamation Service. Checking stations are set up in Southern California at Fern Creek in June Lake area, Convict Creek, and at Isabella ranger station on the Kern River. There are several northern California stations.

Distinctive fin markings are carried by fish planted in these areas in the past few years. From creel studies, the experts can determine the adaptability of certain species to the waters, amount of natural food available and other items pertinent to successful trout plantings.

OHIO VILLAGE SETS UP CYCLE COURT FOR YOUTH XENIA, O. (U.P.) — There is a "bicycle court," to try cases of juvenile traffic violators on wheels, in Yellow Springs, a village near here.

The "court" was established by Charles Wyndham, the village traffic officer, with the co-operation of high and grade school students who ride bicycles. Traffic violators are tried before an executive board composed of representatives from the schools.

Fred Ward Succumbs to Injuries Caused by Fall From Auto

Funeral services for Fred Ward, 40, who died in a Los Angeles hospital Tuesday as the result of injuries sustained Sunday night, will be held Saturday at 2 p. m. at the H. R. Halverson Mortuary in San Pedro.

Ward was riding on the running board of a car driven by Mrs. Laura Knowles of San Pedro early Sunday evening and was thrown off at the corner of 216th street and Pennsylvania, suffering concussion of the brain.

His injuries proved more serious than at first thought and death came Tuesday. Ward, who was a longshoreman, leaves a wife, Vesta, living at 25022 Pennsylvania, three children, Cal, Goldie June and Bonnie Jean; three sisters and one brother.
