Scheduled to be completed early in 1941, contracts awarded today were for construction of 28 miles of pipe lines which will deliver Colorado River water to Orange County cities of Anaheim, Fullerton and Santa Ana.

The American Concrete and Steel Pipe Company of Los Angeles was awarded a contract for construction of 19 miles of precast concrete pipe line at a bid price of \$997,399.75.

Known as the Orange County Feeder of the Metropolitan Aqueduct, the 28-mile pipe line will run south from a point near La Verne to Santa Ana and will pass through Fullerton and Anaheim. It will be connected to the aqueduct distribution system at the point where the Metropolitan Water District is now building a large water softening and filtration plant to soften and filter all Colorado River water used for domestic and industrial purposes in the 13 cities of the Water District.

The action of the District's directorate practically completed awarding of contracts for construction of the 392 mile Metropolitan Aqueduct, which stretches clear across California and which will eventually bring a billion gallons of water a day from the distant Colorado River to Torrance and 12 other cities on the coastal plain of Southern California.

Three occupants of a car were arrested by Torrance police in Walteria early Saturday morning and charged with being drunk in an auto. All plead guilty to the charge when haled before City Judge Robert Lessing.

Ray J. Pogue, 42, steelworker living in Redondo Beach was fined \$50 of which \$40 was suspended; Donald Bickford, 27, Long Beach was also fined \$50 and had \$40 of it suspended, and Mrs. Mona McGuire, 29, Redondo Beach had a \$50 fine suspended for two years.

LAST MAJOR CONTRACTS OF GREAT AQUEDUCT PROJECT AWARDED FOR FEEDER LINE

Pointing toward completion of the world's largest aqueduct and one of the greatest construction jobs in the history of the West, directors of the Metropolitan Water District this week awarded the last major contracts in connection with building of the giant Metropolitan Aqueduct.

Known as the Orange County Feeder of the Metropolitan Aqueduct, the 28-mile pipe line will run south from a point near La Verne to Santa Ana and will pass through Fullerton and Anaheim.

Guarantees Water Supply. Work now under construction includes the ultra modern water softening and filtration plant near La Verne, which is now approximately 60 percent completed.

Engineering work on the Metropolitan Aqueduct has been under way continuously since 1923, and actual construction work on the giant project has been under way since December, 1932. Since that time more than 35,000 people have been directly employed on aqueduct construction work.

Contracts awarded this week, as well as work now under construction, are expected to be completed and the entire aqueduct system ready for operation early next year.
