A vigorous campaign by the women of Los Angeles county to re-elect District Attorney Byron Fitts at the August primary is now in progress, with representatives of all walks of life taking a strong and active part. Virtually every woman's club, church and professional group and cultural organization is represented in the county-wide women's movement in Fitts' behalf, it is reported.

Fitts reported this week that his office during July of this year obtained convictions in 89 percent of the 692 felony cases prosecuted in the courts. He declared he had been informed that this record has never been equaled in a community of major size in this country.

"We are fighting crime in this county as a business," Fitts declared. "It is a big job, a hard job, but I want you to know that it is a job for which I have enthusiasm. The only pledge I make is that I shall always put everything I have in it, to the best of my ability, so long as the people of this county shall remain me as their district attorney."


