Defense Demands "Yes" Vote On Prop. No. 9

Defense demands of the Calloway coast demand a "yes" vote on Proposition Number 9 on the Nov. 5th ballot. This argument was advanced this week by the California Marine Council at the same time moves were going forward to co-ordinate activities of the American-owned fishing fleet with the defense program of the United States navy.

Favorable action on Proposition Number 9 will do three major things, the Marine Council pointed out. These are:

1—Correct local tax discrimination by eliminating local taxes now collected by only four coast counties. The other fifty-four counties receive no benefit;

2—Encourage the American-owned fishing fleet to continue operation from California ports, keeping the boats here as a valuable defense unit in case of national emergency. It will discourage their removal to Oregon or Washington ports;

3—Retain to the state the right to collect taxes on all boats for the benefit of the entire state. It will make possible the taxation of large steamships which now pay no taxes.

Officials of the Marine Council today pointed out that owners of the American-owned boats in the California fleet have volunteered their services to the navy. Action was taken at a recent conference in Monterey between boat owners and naval officials. Defense work of the fishing boats probably would involve minelaying and mine sweeping.
